"DO YOU KNOW YOUR HISTORY? Part III....The observatory was dedicated on July 23, 1955, after a luncheon at the Original Murphy's. Unfortunately, the scope's maiden voyage to the stars was postponed that evening because of rain."

That was over 59 years ago. Hey, Rich Tennis--how old were you then and where you there that night? I thought so. Your jinx started way back then?

"The 18th annual convention of the Astronomical League's North Central Region will be held at Racine, Wisconsin, May 16, 1964....The registration fee of \$1.50 may be paid in advance or between 9 and 10 o'clock...."

\$1.50? Heck, you can't even get a Big Mac for that now. \$1.50 would not even get you a half gallon of gas now. You could not get to Racine on that--maybe Chillicothe

25 Years Ago September Starlite 1989

*"With the election of new officers being held at the banquet, this is my last message to you as president. I look to this time, a time of change, as the moving ahead of the Society (Mike Hay)."*
