As of July 1, 2012 the Cat matching gifts program changed. Employees/Retirees are asked to submit matching gift forms electronically via the Caterpillar Foundation website, www.caterpillar.com/foundation.

Spring Newsletter, 1964

"Since 1952, the Astronomy Section of the Peoria Academy of Science had eagerly eyed the 9" telescope owned by Bradley University. Bradley had purchased this instrument from the Illinois Watch Company of Springfield, Illinois in 1935. Because no one had the opportunity to build an observatory to house her, the scope gathered dust on the Bradley campus for seventeen years."

"Now let's take a look at the telescope we had acquired. She was constructed in 1909Her nine-inch lens--she's a refractor you know--was fashioned by the Gaertner Scientific Company by the same optician who ground the lens for the famous physicist A. A. Michelson."

Of the famous Michelson-Morley experiment fame. Hey, I studied them in high school physics, in which class I was not very good. Oh well, you don't need to know much physics to be a star hopper.

25 Years Ago Winter/Spring, Starlite 1988/89

"The close approach of Mars this year brought many people out to Northmoor....We tried our hands at drawing what we saw. For my part, I found my drawing very limited. I learned increased respect for the pre-photographic astronomers who projected their visual impressions with their pencils and pens!"

The savings ending balance had two different amounts reported—the correct amount is \$14,039.10. Nick Johnson reported the observing season was over. The last viewing season occurred on a partly cloudy night with a total of 16 visitors. Overall it was a successful viewing season, with 909 registered visitors. Bob Pauer was unable to attend the meeting. Rich Tennis reported that \$4200 was disbursed on painting at Jubilee. The mower at Jubilee was repaired at the expense of \$26.50. Scott Swords reported there were no new members since the last meeting. He reported the current PAS membership stands at 113, 86 of them have email addresses in the database and 53 are members of the e-group. Nick suggested that the email via the e-group be the primary method of communication. The January 8th program will be Aurora Borealis by Don Hampton.

DECEMBER 18, 2013

Minutes from the November meeting were reviewed, corrected and approved. No treasurer's report was available at this meeting. It will be sent out by the end of the year. Scott Swords reported no new members. A new member's application was discussed and will be redesigned. Mike Hay reported that one Starlite was returned due to the change of address. He will resend it. Mike received a message from Doug Stitzel who has William Optics 2" binoviewers with eyepieces and offered to donate it to the club. Discussion took place about storage and usage. Mike suggested using if for public viewings. Rich Tennis volunteered to be the primary contact for the item. Jesse Hoover reported the program by Donald Hampton on Aurora Borealis will take place on January 8. Jesse reported he sent thank you letters to the two presenter for the November and December programs. One of them declined payment and the other accepted a check in the amount of \$50. Jesse reported the city of Canton had been contacted concerning light control and we are waiting for a response. Hanna City has committed to implementing the light control policy by the end of the year. Gary Bussman reported observing sessions for the spring need to be schedule before the February Board meeting. Mike pointed out the evening of January 1st is a rare opportunity to see an 18 hour old moon about 15 minutes after sunset. The meteor showers will be visible in the morning of January 3rd coming from the constellation of Bootes. Rich Tennis raised a question on Eric's behalf about the ability to send attachments. Mike Frasca reported when e-group was established, attachments used to slow down emails, sot the Board voted not to allow attachments. He reported there are pros and cons to having the ability to allow them. More discussion included copyright laws, links rather than attachments and filtering. The motion to approve the link option was made and approved by the majority.

JANUARY 15, 2014

Minutes from the December meeting were reviewed and approved. Dan Son handed out the reports for two months. 36 out of 86 members paid their dues. A second notice will be mailed out in a week. Nick Johnson reported that the windows at the observatory were insulated. There were no further updates for Northmoor. Scott Swords reported three new members, Paul and Doreen Henson of Dunlap, John Nixon of Peoria, and Nicolas Yemm of Bartonville. Scott pointed out the new application and the new members letter had been redesigned and the group had been notified of the changes. Jesse Hoover reported on the recent program via Skype. The video was lost halfway through the presentation, audio still worked. Jesse suggested keeping presentation via Skype. Discussion followed about getting speakers for programs. Gary Bussman suggested posting phases of the moon and the schedule of star parties on the e-group site. Eric reported tentative dates for ICC viewing are April 25 or 26, May 1,3,9, or 10. Possible dates for the annual banquet are September 13, 20, or 27. Gary said he would try to organize the Lake Thunderbird event. Eric Clifton reported the 3 eyepieces thought to be missing after the break-in had been found. Eric spoke to Tim McGrath about buying his dob to make it a loaner telescope. After a long discussion, the motion to purchase the telescope and electronics was made and passed by the majority of votes.
